- Title One conferences (held in the fall)
- Parent Teacher Conferences (to make an appointment, email or call 979-730-7195)
- Progress reports 3 times/year and report cards at the end of every grading period.
- Notes, emails, or phone calls.

### Students

- Share my RUBY and homework folder with my parent/caregiver everyday.
- Complete my class work and homework every day.
- Follow classroom and school expectations and procedures.
- Learn to solve problems in a positive, non-violent way.
- Read the required amount of time set by my teacher every day.
- Respect my teacher, friends, and property of the school.

## Teachers

- Treat all students justly and with respect.
- Hold high expectations for all students.
- Respectfully and accurately inform parents of their child's progress.
- Respect and understand the uniqueness of students and their families.
- Resolve conflicts in a positive, respectful way.
- Provide a safe environment with professional behavior and a positive attitude for learning.
- Communicate with each parent/guardian in regards to a child receiving an office referral on the day of the incident.

### Parents

- Check and sign my child's RUBY folder daily.
- Get my child to school every day on time.
- Read with my child every day for at least 20 minutes.
- Encourage my child's learning, ideas, and show respect for the school.
- Encourage my child to respect the rights and differences of others.
- Resolve conflicts in a positive, non-violent way.
- Communicate with my child's teacher and work with them in regards to student's concerns.
